Pass-out for Bible Doctrines

Words used in the Greek presenting aspects of sin.

Definitions:

1. #266 “hamartia” (ha mar tee yah) Romans.5: 12-20 - Sin – This is the failure to hit the mark.
2. #3876 “parakoe” (par ah ko ay) Romans 5: 19 – Disobedience – This is failure to give attention to God, His direction, His Word, when given by the Holy Spirit.
3. #3847 “barabasis” (par ah bah sis) Romans 4: 15 – Transgression – This is passing beyond an assigned limit. It is trespassing. When God set a boundary or limit it is for our own good.
4. #3900 “paratoma” (par aptoe mah) Matthew 6: 14 – Trespass – This is falling down when the believer should have stood up. It is getting angry because someone got angry with you. It is the wrong reaction to a situation or person.
5. #51 “agnoema” (ag no ay mah) Hebrews 9: 7 – Error – An error due to ignorance or something we do not know or will know.
6. #2275 “hettema” (het tay mah) Romans 11: 12 – Failure/Fault – This is that which makes you worse or defeats you. It is that which does not better you when you do it, such as certain relationships or habits that weigh you down. In themselves they are not serious, but they slow progress and are a weight that may lead to a worse thing.
7. #763 “asebeia” (ah seb bay) Romans 1: 18 – Ungodliness – This is an ungodly act that actively leaves God out.

Unless there is an intense longing for deliverance from sin, people fall back to the power of the flesh. The holiness which the New Covenant offers that person who does not want to be free will terrify them rather than attract them.
